Students (both in person and on senior surveys) have consistently complained about the difficulties of fulfilling the particular course requirements of the Classical Humanities major and seem not to realize, no matter how clearly we state it, that they can make substitutions for the specified requirements. After deliberation, it seemed better to simplify the language of the major and bring it more in line with the requirements for the Greek and Latin majors (the language of which is not changing). We believe the revised language, which still requires a combination of 200 and 300+ level courses and a required language course, will provide students with the
